Description :

'Mahi', a ball or spherical element (lower right hand); the interpretation of this attribute is much debated. It has been interpreted as a globe representing the earth, 'mahi', (which is questionable since the earth was considered to be flat in Cambodia until recent times). A lotus flower or fruit are other readings. In Vedic literature the lotus was associated with water and creation. "The god Brahma, the Indian god of creation, was born in a lotus (growing from Vishnu's navel), and the lotus became an Indian metaphor for the created world."
