



## Northern Plains Buffalo Horn Feast Spoon

This spoon exhibits great age and patina from extended ethnographic use. The imposing size indicates the horn was from an enormous Great Plains buffalo bull. The horns from these huge bulls were very important prestige objects to Native Americans of the Plains; by the 3rd quarter of the 19th century, Anglo trophy hunters had exterminated the largest buffalo bulls.
